The MIICT consortium member <u>FUNDEA</u> received the Award "Andalusia for Migration" by the local government of Andalucía in the category "Social Awareness and/or Interculturality on the Internet" for the IMMERSE Platform.

The platform received the prestigious award due to its objective to promote the integration of migrants through information, dialogue and the use of technology.

In the final months of the project the consortium worked on a **general plan for sustainability and uptake** of the IMMERSE platform, as well as on **individual exploitation plans** for each of the partners of the consortium. Seven exploitable assets have been identified, which will be used, promoted and developed further after the end of the MIICT project: research outcomes; ethics framework; policies and practices; technical concepts, design and piloting; the IMMERSE platform; networks and partnerships; and manuals and guides. Each of the items has its own relevance to the technical partners, research partners and service providers represented in the MIICT project team.

Partners are currently working on a strategy to bring the IMMERSE solution to the market. **Two strategies** have been identified as promising: offering IMMERSE as a complete **software package** to service providers (such as NGOs and public administrations), or providing the IMMERSE platform in the form of a **software as a service**, which can be licenced by service providers but will be maintained by the technical partners of the MIICT project. The results from the 2nd Migration Policy Roundtable fed into the drafting of a handbook which summarizes the main take-aways of the event. MIICT recommends that

- the EC strongly encourages local governments and public bodies to take ownership of novel ICT solutions that have proven successful in the field and have garnered support from NGOs, service providers and migrants.
- the digital education of migrants and the breaking down of the digital barriers are recognised as **common goals** among all states in the European community.
- **trust in ICT tools** is fostered through targeted policy and legislation in the area of personal data protection, cybersecurity and cyber rights of migrants.
- the EC enables governments to financially secure the long-term exploitation of such successful digital social innovations.


Publication on ICT for migration
